- **Submit a Letter of Intent** to confirm that your organization is eligible to apply for grants\*\* and that your project meets the criteria for one or more of our available grantmaking funds. Visit <u>polkccf.org/applications</u> for details on how to submit this.
- Receive Confirmation that your project meets the Foundation's criteria for funding. Contact our Director of Grants with questions about the grantmaking process. Email Noah Wood at grants@polkccf.org or call 828-859-5314 x 226.
- **Submit a Grant Application** by the deadlines noted above. Applications must be submitted online by accessing our Grants portal at <u>polkccf.org/applications</u>. All applications are due by 5:00 pm on the dates indicated.
